

PANOSTEITIS TREATMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

This condition is sometimes seen in young, fast-growing dogs of the larger breeds. It is sometimes also called “**Eosinophilic Panosteitis.**” With this disease, the young dog shows signs of lameness and pain in the long bones of the legs.

Cause for the inflammation is unknown, but the limbs can be extremely sore.

The condition may last several months--even up to one year, but usually runs its course in 3-4 months. Pain is sporadic and intermittent with lameness only being present part of the time.

The dog will usually totally recover with no permanent effects after the fast-growing period of its life is over. Different legs may be affected at different times during the growing period of the dog.
